Subject: Capital Budget

The attached 2021 Capital Budget was originally presented in October. Since the Capital Budget was last discussed by the C&C Committee in November, adjustments were made to several projects to account for slower than anticipated progress through the end of the year, shifting costs from 2020 to 2021, however total project costs remain the same. Staff increased the Annual Repairs, Replacements and Line Relocations budget from \$150,000 to \$175,000 to account for the tone wire repair project as well as ongoing I&I elimination work anticipated in 2021. Staff increased the budget for #1911 Lift Station 11 Pump and Control Panel Replacement to \$175,000 to account for a larger scope of work and higher construction costs.

Recommended Action: Recommend the Board approve the Capital Budget.

**Subject:** Locate Wire Repair Contract Award

Staff issued a Request for Quotes to eight local contractors and received only one response from TPI Utility Construction for \$45,000. Staff believes this is a fair price for the work, which includes exposing buried pipes at 15 locations throughout our service area and extending locate wire up to the service. This will allow staff to complete utility locate requests by contractors and homeowners via Indiana 811 in an accurate and timely manner. Pipelines at these locations are currently unlocatable because of damaged locate wire. Many locations have already been repaired by Collections and Engineering staff where heavy excavation equipment wasn't required. If awarded, the work will be completed in early 2021 and budgeted under the Capital Budget - Annual Repairs, Replacements, and Relocations.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: Recommend the Board award the tone wire repair construction contract to TPI Utility Construction for \$45,000.

**Subject:** Capital Project Updates

The following updates are provided for ongoing capital projects. Please refer to the Capital Project Fact Sheets for background information on individual projects.

1. #1802 – Haver Way Sewer Improvements (located southwest of Keystone and 96<sup>th</sup> Street)

Work is underway on site. Crews expect to have the new lift station online late next month. Completion is due in May.

2. #1901 – Lift Station 14 Parallel Force Main (located along Michigan Road from Austin Oaks to Ansley Park)

Work is substantially complete and the new force main is in service. Punch list work is expected to be complete shortly.

3. #1902 - TriCo WRRF Expansion

Crews continued installing equipment in all three new clarifiers as well as the mixed liquor splitter. Backfilling and process piping installation continued in the area. The last large concrete pours were completed on construction of the new VLRs. Several smaller concrete pours remain. Finish work within these structures is ongoing with equipment installation to follow.

Work began on the grit structure, which is an addition onto the south side of the pretreatment building. This structure is not as large as the VLRs or clarifiers, however it is quite complex and will require many separate concrete pours to finish.

Electrical work continues as equipment is delivered to the site. Crews began removing the original screen in the pretreatment building and assembling new UV equipment. Overall the work continues on schedule and below budget.

4. #1906 – Eagle Creek Outfall Sewer Expansion (located between TriCo WRRF and Eagle Creek to the west)

Crews completed open cut sewer installation near Lift Station 11, which required closing Old 106<sup>th</sup> Street. The road closing was coordinated with Zionsville and nearby businesses. The road has been resurfaced and is now open. Installation of the splitter structure at the plant is underway. We are waiting for Vectren to relocate a gas main along Zionsville Road. Open cut installation will continue this month and next month. While completion is due in April, the general contractor expects to finish the work early.

#### 5. #1910 – Office Unification

Punch list work continues by various contractors. Control Tech is replacing the lab HVAC system, which was separate from the office construction contract; work should be complete shortly. Staff requested various furniture modifications from RJE. Staff spent several weeks working with what was provided, which works well for most, however several items didn't meet staff needs. RJE has several furniture pieces and replacement parts that they are waiting to receive and install. Architects at Blackline is working on solutions for acoustics in the open office, lobby, and training/board room, as well as interior décor.

# 6. #1911 – Lift Station 11 Pump and Control Panel Replacement

We are waiting for delivery of new pumps. ACE Technologies is modifying the control panel from decommissioned Lift Station 4 for reuse. Staff is waiting for Duke Energy to provide a schedule for upgrading electric service. Once Duke's schedule is known staff will receive quotes for installation of pumps, piping, and electrical equipment.

7. #2002 – Lift Station 2 (106th/Spring Mill Road) Odor Control System Replacement

Staff will receive quotes for installation of the new odor control system in late January. Equipment will be delivered by February and installed at that time.

#### 8. #2003 – 2020 Neighborhood Sewer Extensions

The new low pressure sewer mains are all in service and homeowners in all four neighborhoods have been notified that service is available. Punch list work, including restoration, is expected to be complete shortly. Staff continues to monitor Woodhaven and Timber Ridge neighborhoods after a few homeowners voiced concerns about restoration.

#### 10. #2004 – Lift Station 1 Repairs

The generator supplier notified staff that delivery has been pushed back to February. Installation will follow delivery.
