

## Paying Your Bill

The monthly bill is typically mailed on the 4<sup>th</sup> of the month and is always due on the 20<sup>th</sup>. Payments can be made by setting up auto debit or mailing the payment to the P.O. Box on the bill stub. If you prefer to pay in person, TriCo's office is located at 10701 N. College Avenue, Suite A. You are always welcome to come in the office or use the drive-up drop box located in front of the Government Center. After the 20<sup>th</sup>, a 10% late fee is added to the current balance.

The auto debit form is available to download from [www.TriCo.eco](http://www.TriCo.eco) or you can call the office to have a form mailed. The completed form must be returned to TriCo's office. You will continue to receive a bill each month stating the amount due and that this amount will be deducted from your checking account on the 20<sup>th</sup>.

Payments may also be made with a credit card. PayGov, a third party provider, processes the payment. A convenience fee will be added based on the amount of the payment and will be shown prior to processing the payment. Once the total amount is shown, you will have the option to proceed or cancel the transaction.

Payments may also be paid through your bank's online bill pay.

## New name... Same Great Utility

In 2017 the Board of Trustees determined it was time to change the District's name from Clay Township Regional Waste District to TriCo Regional Sewer Utility to better represent the regional sewer service provided by the agency in Hamilton, Boone and Marion Counties.

The purpose of the TriCo Regional Sewer Utility, since its founding as Clay Township Regional Waste District in 1975, has been to provide effective and efficient sanitary sewer service to our customer base in an environmentally sensitive manner. Originally established to serve the Home Place area, the service area expanded over the years to serve the west half of Carmel/Clay Township, eastern parts of Zionsville and developments in Marion County north of I-465. As of June 2018, the District provides sewer service to over 15,100 customers and continues to see steady growth.

While the name has changed, TriCo remain committed to providing the highest quality service at the most competitive rates.


### Residential Billing

Residential customers with metered water service pay a charge based on their water meter size. They also pay a consumption charge based on their average winter water usage. The new balanced billing will be reflected on the August bill and will continue for the next 12 months. The benefit of bal-

anced billing is that customers aren't charged for summer watering or other outside usage. Residential customers on private wells as their water source pay a flat rate of \$33.51.

### Rate Ordinance #05-14-2018

In July, the TriCo Board of Trustees approved the 2018 Rate Ordinance which included a 5% user rate increase that will be effective August 1, 2018 and reflected on the August 31, 2018 bill. The rate increase is needed to fund capital improvement projects and costs associated with the maintenance of the existing infrastructure. For customers using 5,000 gallons of water per month, the increase will be \$1.59 per month resulting in a monthly bill of \$27.75.



With this increase, your rates continue to be one of the lowest in the area as shown above.

The 5% rate increase is not a result of new development. New development pays an EDU (equivalent dwelling unit) fee of \$1908 which is collected from builders to cover the cost of additional capacity at the wastewater treatment plant. Interceptor fees are also collected on a per acre basis to cover the cost of extending interceptor sewers to service new areas. This practice of collecting fees from new development has allowed TRICO to make needed ca-

capacity additions without charging existing customers for the improvements.

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The Capital Improvements made with revenue received from user fees include upgrades to existing equipment due to age and the addition of new treatment equipment needed to meet changing compliance standards. These capital improvement projects are undertaken to maintain an environmentally sound utility.
